VISIT TO THE CHILDREN FROM THE EBENEZAR HOME IN ANJI

Anji is the ,headquarter' of RBM. In the building RBM locates the Ebenezar children home, the community/church room, the home of Brother and Sister (including guest room where I stayed), the RBM administration offices and a school.

Below I will show you my impressions about the <u>Ebenezar children home</u> and the children.



SOME INFORMATION...

All girls sleep in the headquarter building , the boys sleep in a rented room. Both are located in Anji, <u>Wardha district</u> in the Maharashtra state in western India.

- Older Children get up a 4:00 am, start to study. All Children get up with the first cock cry at 5:00 am, start to wash themselves, have breakfast.
- Afterwards they start with their rotating tasks one group starts the clean up work (rooms, yard...). One group participates in the cooking and serving the food to the others. The older children wash their clothes by themselves, for children below 10 years a laundry lady is coming.
- All check on their proper studies. From Monday till Saturday two groups are going to School, the first starts at 7:00 am to 11:30 am to a governmental school in Anji (local language is <u>Marathi</u>). The second group starts at 12:00 till 17:30 to the same school. Vice versa the groups are studying.
- Mrs Jyoti (caretaker) takes care of all the children.
- The location: In the front part of the headquarter building, the hostel is in the ground floor and in the first floor (top) **Mr. Isaac Israel and his wife Mrs. Santhy Isaac (called Brother and Sister)** founder of RBM are living; also a bigger community/church room is located. The children have a safe playground within the walls of the RBM head quarter. In the back part of the building the school and the RBM offices are located.
- 4 buses start each day from this location to pick up school children and drive them to the Good Shepherd English School at Anji. School starts at 10:40 and goes till 15:40, children get lunch during mid-day. After school the buses bring the children back to their villages.
- Sundays the children have first a service and then the Sunday school goes on till lunch. After lunch free time. Sometimes the children are taken out by bus to the nature for playing. On Sunday evening they get to see a film.
- Even though the hostel is run on Christians values, nobody is forced to be a Christian and to join e.g. service.

THE CHILDREN IN ANJI EBENEZAR HOME

The hostel Anji takes care of 35 Boys and 106 Girls, supported by the <u>partner Caruna Bal Vikas</u>. 3 orphans and 7 semi orphans. All others are very poor and destitute. The children visit from 5th grade up to 12th grade and graduation level. Currently 71 Children (69 Girls and 2 boys) live directly in the Ebenezar Home, others live with their families near the Home. They come for meals, clothes, studying etc.





DINNER IN ANJI





The menu is changed over the week. Here rice, egg, roti and an vegetarian meal.

THE ROOMS

Example of one girls room. Shelves to store the only property of the childs. One bag, suitecase or something similar. As bed serves a floor mat and a cover. Room to sleep, eat, study and play. This is their home. This is everything for them.



HOMEWORK FOR SCHOOL

No chair, no desk. All material provided By donations for RBM. Studies are important. They help to get an own future, a job to earn own money, to break the cyle of poverty & dependency on aid.

GET UP AT AROUND 5 AM AND WASH YOURSELF

Older Children get up a 4:00 am, start to study. All Children get up with the first cock cry at 5:00 am, start to wash themselves, have breakfast, start the

cleaning up work (rooms, yard...). The pump for drinking water and a well for the rest...



THE CHILDREN HAVE ROTATING TASKS

Besides school work the children have rotating tasks:

- Support cooking and serve the others
- Clean the community room, the own rooms, toilets
- Older children carring for younger (e.g. taking a bath) Dog care
- Wash the clothes



Children are taken in responsibility, they learn to stand on their own feet and help themselves and the others.



- Watering the plants
- Clean the yard

3 times a year clothes – here the clothes for some girls for Christmas; sizes still need to be adapted.

CHILDREN OF THE , FIRST' GENERATION

24 children are studying in the college /university, but still come to the Home to get their supplies monthly (which includes toilet items, clothes and pocket money) – two of them you see below.



The entrance to the hostel & school ground on the left.

On the right 2 ex-students with Sister(mrs.Santhy Isaac) being the first children in RBM, of **Brother and Sister. Family** bondage brings them to visit, chat, ask for advice. They have no other family or support. One's an engineer, the other a medical nurse. Prithi Khairkar (L), Sister (Mrs. Isaac Israel) and



<u>Jyoti Srinate (</u>R). Without RBM – many by heart given donations - no chance for such education and jobs!¹⁵

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION

Service in the community/ church room. Participation is free, not forced. Praying, singing, listening to the word of God as written in the Bible. Children are asked to recheck the all the teachings in the Bible.

My name is Dipali Sontakke, I am studied from 3rd grade until 10th grade in Ebenezar Girls Home at Anji. I would like to Thank God and Brother and Sister for their love and care that they provided me through my childhood. I certainly believe that Jesus is the only Living God.

I am glad that God choose me out of the many others in my community, and brought me to the Ebenezar Girls Home, this was a great blessing for me. Now I am having the privilege to get educated and study very well.
